*Returning Hillside campers may bring the drawers you used last year or can purchase the recommended plastic drawers above. All new campers should bring the drawers listed above.

Returning Woodside campers **NOT in **Carmel this summer** may bring the drawers you used last year or can purchase the recommended plastic drawers above. Woodside Carmel campers **should** bring the drawers linked in the table above.

***Under-the-bed containers should be no taller than 10-12 inches (beds may differ).

****K'far Noar campers and campers living in the Lodge cannot bring plastic drawers. Additional storage furniture has been installed in those living areas. These campers may ship clothing to camp prior to opening day or bring 1 bag of clothes on opening day.

WHAT'S NEW IN 2023



TOWEL SERVICE!

This summer, Camp Harlam will be providing clean towels at our Lake and pools. Campers will dry themselves off before they leave to go back to their cabins. All towels will be stored at the Lake and pools. Fresh, clean towels will be available daily. Families should not send beach towels to camp, but should still pack bath towels for campers to use during shower time in their cabin.

K'FAR AND LODGE STORAGE

We are excited to share that we are installing brand new custom wood storage solutions to both K'far Noar and the Lodge living areas. These new cubbies eliminate the need for additional plastic drawers in these living areas. Campers living in K'far Noar or the Lodge **may not** bring plastic drawers to camp this summer. Please refer to the chart above for reminders of your camper's living area.

PLASTIC DRAWERS

Plastic drawers are only allowed in Woodside, Hillside and Chavurah villages for summer 2023. Please see the chart above for sizing and links to plastic drawers. Plastic drawers should be sealed or taped shut when sent/brought/dropped-off at camp.

BEFORE CAMP VS OPENING DAY

All campers, whether traveling to camp by car or bus, must send or drop-off baggage to camp prior to opening day with the following:

- Linens (bedding, towels)
- Toiletries (that do not fit in an opening day backpack)
- Outerwear and hanging items (jackets, sweatshirts, Shabbat clothes)
- Shoes

Families are welcome to send anything else from the packing list in advance as well. But at the very minimum, families **must** send the things on the list above to ensure that counselors can make their camper's beds and begin to set up their areas before their arrival.

What is allowed on opening day?

All campers, whether traveling to camp by car or bus, may bring the following items:

- Plastic drawers*
- Clothes must be inside the plastic drawers; no additional bags will be accepted during drop off or allowed on the bus
- Under the bed container (for miscellaneous items)
- Backpack

*K'far Noar (current 8th grade), Intro Experience Rishonim, 1st session female-identifying Carmel (current 2nd-3rd grade) campers cannot bring plastic drawers. These campers may ship clothing to camp prior to opening day or bring 1 bag of clothes on opening day.

LINENS

- 3 bath towels (to use for showering)
- 2 face towels (for hand & face washing)

TOILETRIES

- Maccabiah (Color War) items
 - 1 red, 1 gold, 1 blue & 1 green t-shirt
 - Red, gold, blue & green face paint, bandanas, beads, etc.
- Dress-up costumes for Rak Dan Israeli Dancing (for rising 6th graders and older), Unit Programs & more! (neon, crazy hats, hawaiian shirts)
- Extra white shirt for costume

CLOTHING

- 18 pairs of underwear
- Bras, if needed
- 18 pairs of socks
- 16 t-shirts and/or tank tops
- 3 long sleeve shirts
- 4 sweatshirts
- 1 light jacket (optional)
- 12 pairs of shorts
- 3 pairs of long pants
- 1 raincoat (must have a hood)
- 7 pairs of pajamas
- 2 nice Shabbat outfits for Friday nights (polo shirt, skirt or dress)
- 2 white shirts for Shabbat morning
- 6 bathing suits
- Swimming goggles, if needed
- 1 hat (not a visor)

SHOES

K'FAR NOAR HIKE

Campers in K'far Noar (rising 9th graders) should also pack the following items for an overnight hike:

- 1-liter water bottle
- Outdoor sleeping bag
- · Hiking boots or sturdy pair of shoes/sneakers

PACKING FAQ'S



1. What should I pack for Shabbat?	On Friday nights and Saturday mornings, everyone at Camp Harlam wears white. On Friday nights, most people wear nicer white shirts with khakis or jeans, a white shirt with a white skirt, or a white dress. On Saturdays, most people wear white t-shirts or tank tops with shorts. Campers and staff wear sneakers or sandals, sometimes a slightly nicer pair than other days, but no heels.
2. What type of bathing suit does my child need for camp?	Campers need bathing suits that are suitable for being very active in the pool and lake. Campers in Carmel, Sharon and Kineret (current 2nd-5th grades) should bring at least two athletic suits for instructional swim. We allow two-piece bathing suits for campers, but they should be appropriate for activities, and we discourage packing string bikinis (for more information about our dress code, see our Family Handbook.)
3. What about electronics?	In keeping with our desire to build a community at Camp Harlam that is focused on healthy engagement with other people and our unique surroundings, Camp Harlam has a screen-free electronics policy. The only electronics campers are permitted to bring to camp are an MP3 player without a touch screen, a CD player, and an inexpensive digital camera. Additional information about our electronics policy will be shared in a separate communication.
4. Should I label what is sent to camp?	Label Everything! And we do mean everything! All items that come to camp should have your child's first and last name marked clearly. Anything and everything can be misplaced, and this helps us make sure lost items find their way back to their rightful owners. You can use a permanent marker, or order labels. There is an option to purchase labels directly through your CampInTouch account - just log in and click "Camper Clothing Labels."



5. What kind of luggage should I pack in?	You can pack in a soft trunk, or duffle bag - your choice! Unless you pack directly in the plastic drawers, the luggage you pack in will not be used to store your child's items during camp. Your camper will have cubbies that are provided to them to store all of their personal items.
6. Should I pack my favorite, most expensive things to camp?	When packing, please remember that Camp Harlam is not responsible for personal effects that are damaged or lost. Also remember that it's camp! Other than having something nicer things for Shabbat (which is still relatively casual), there's no need for anything fancy.
7. Can I bring more than what's on the packing list?	It's always tempting to send lots of extras, but trust us when we say this list is carefully curated from many years of experience. If you follow the list, your camper will have more than enough stuff, but if you bring more, it may not fit in the storage space we provide and may make it more challenging for your camper to keep their things organized. We do laundry every week, so the number of each item needed does not change with the length of the session. We encourage packing with your child - if they are younger, it helps them to know what they have with them, and if they are older, it allows you to make sure they're following the list.
